Due to Report information relating to COVID:

Each club pledged a certain amount in monetary donations and those funds were used to purchase items from wish lists of low-income Military families from Camp Pendleton and 29 Palms. GFWC Federated East Valley Woman's Club solicited funds, shopped and wrapped gifts for 13 families. It was a lot of work but they were glad their "sister club" asked them to help with the project. "It was wonderful to work with Sonja Reed, Chairman of "Making Spirits Bright" project. What a wonderful feeling it is to know that working together we have brightened the holidays for these military families", stated Pat Borchard.



CHEESY GREEN CHILE & CHICKEN CAULIFLOWER ENCHILADA CASSEROLE

ngredients:

- 1 head of fresh cauliflower or, 20 oz frozen cauilflower florets (4 C.)
- 4 oz cream cheese , very softened
- 1 C. cooked chicken, shredded
- 1/2 C. green enchilada sauce (salsa verde)
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
- 1 tsp kosher salt

stick to 3X5 index

- 1/2 C. sour cream
- 1 C. shredded cheddar, separated (1/2 + 1/2)
- Optional: chopped fresh cilantro, chopped green onions & sour

Instructions

- 1- If you are using fresh cauliflower, cut the base and cut the head into small florets. Place in a steamer tray, fill a medium saucepan with a few inches of water, place the steamer basket of cauliflower within the saucepan and steam the cauliflower for 4-5 minutes or until soft.
- 2- While the cauliflower is steaming, combine the cream cheese with the chicken, salsa verde, salt, pepper, 1/2 C. sour cream and 1/2 C. cheese.
- 3- Stir in the drained cauliflower, and pour into a casserole
- 4- Sprinkle remaining 1/2 C. cheese on top evenly.
- 5- Bake at 350 for 20 minutes or until lightly brown

Serve hot - top with sour cream, green onions or cilantro

Six Degrees of Separation

Two months ago I posed the following question to SGVD members: What did WWII, The United Nations, JFK, Inga "Binga", Eleanor Roosevelt, and the General Federation of Women's Clubs have in common? In Part 1 I discussed what was taking place in Germany and the United States from the 1930's and 1940's. I talked about WWII, Hitler (Chancellor of Germany), Inga "Binga", (President Kennedy's "true love"), and introduced J. Edgar Hoover (Director of the FBI) into the story. The following month in Part II, I discussed the role Mrs. Roosevelt and the GFWC played in implementing numerous laws (Child Labor, Juvenile court, etc.) throughout the states, and how GFWC was granted a Federal Charter by the 56th U.S. Congress which stipulated that GFWC maintain its headquarters in Washington, D.C.. Eleanor (a club member) assisted GFWC in obtaining their headquarters. Now, In Part III I'll bring our story to a close.

Part III

In 1945 GFWC was one of the five women's organizations chosen to participate in the conference to form the United Nations. At the conference, GFWC representatives supported the ratification of the United Nations Charter. GFWC served on the first U.S. delegation to the United Nations and Eleanor was chair of the UN Human Rights Commission.

Like JFK, Eleanor was also a political leader in her own right. She supported the <u>civil rights</u> <u>movement</u>. After the death of her husband (President Franklin Roosevelt) in 1945, she started her career, as an author, speaker and spokesperson for <u>human rights</u>. Like JFK and Inga "Binga", she was an outspoken and controversial figure during her life, making many interesting friends and powerful enemies, including J. Edgar Hoover, and the FBI.

Eleanor has the distinction of having one of the thickest files compiled by the FBI. She was a vocal opponent of J. Edgar Hoover, calling him an "American gestapo". Prior to her husband's death she kept her silence, but in the years that followed she became increasingly strident in her complaints over Hoover and the FBI. In his personal files, Hoover collected data regarding Eleanor's lesbian relationships, as well as male lovers during her marriage to FDR and her subsequent widowhood. Files referred to lovers, "both male and female, white and black" according to at least one scholar of Hoover's files. Eleanor was supportive of some communist organizations and was an overly enthusiastic supporter of desegregation, both positions which Hoover found threatening to the country. Eventually Eleanor's official FBI file grew to include over 3,000 pages,

In later years, JFK came to Mrs. Roosevelt asking her to support him in his bid for Vice President of the United States on the Democratic ticket. She refused because, as a Senator, he had not spoken against the tactics used by Joseph McCarthy in the investigation of communists in the United States.

When you look at the history of the United States and internationally you rarely see GFWC mentioned. As members we still say "GFWC (or our club) is the best kept secret". Since 1898 **GFWC has** been involved but rarely do we find a mention of us.

It is time to write ourselves back into history. When was the last time you looked through the boxes of history at your own club? Look at old yearbooks, convention minutes and calls, club meeting minutes and the Club newsletter. Check at your local library – do they have files? I know there are women's club histories at Pasadena, Ontario, Covina and Riverside public libraries.

These too are on line. Our history and its relationship to our world history is there. We need to find it and write it back into existence.

As a challenge, pick a famous moment or person in history and see if you can "play" Six Degrees of Separation with your club or with the District. Ideas might be: Red Cross, the songs "America the Beautiful" or "The Battle Hymn of the Republic", Helen Keller, William Randolph Hurst, Korean War, Rosie the Riveter, President Hoover, President Wilson, The Mission Bells, Red Light Districts, spitting on the sidewalk, municipal drinking cups, The Suffrage Movement, Motion Picture Regulations, Covid19, and so much more. Have fun with your history.
