The SGVD Clubs Financial Team Forum met via Zoom on the third Tuesday of October. Here are the highlights.

Clubs with Clubhouses Group: Abbey Howell suggested that financial teams whose oversight includes a may find answers to their specific questions through the Clubhouse Management Group. President Cheryl Alberg (caja2@aol.com 626-250-5815) has graciously extended an invitation those members to join her group. Financial Teamwork: Yvette Romo, SGVD's Financial Secretary, outlined the system she developed. Key to its success is that the steps are followed with consistency. They include:

- Create an approval form
- Make separate deposits for each category
- Logs in transactions as they happen and always be on top of it.
- Approval of payout is based on bylaws, standing rules, and voted-in procedures

Financial Teams as Gatekeepers

- Guidance from Bylaws, standing rules, board and membership voted on procedures. Beholden to that alone.
- Keep accurate records

Sales Tax Laws

- Sales tax permits are required in California if selling material goods for fundraising.
- Selling tickets to functions where a meal is served is income tax exempt as a fraternal organization as long as the venue is not held in a restaurant and all paying guests are women's club members. Guests are paid for by a member or club. Pamphlets are available on the California Department of Tax and Fees website www.cdtfa,gov

WOMEN'S HISTORY - CHAIRWOMAN CLAUDIA MAIDENBURG

What do the Experiences of Ancient Women Leaders Tell us About Success?

We look around our modern world and we see a few but increasing number of female leaders of nations. We see a few and also increasing number of female leaders of large companies and large organizations. Out loud or in hushed whispers their abilities are always questioned. Are these leaders really the first of their kind? The answer to that question is no.

Mesopotamia was ruled by Queen Kubaba who was the world's first known female ruler. She was the Queen of Sumer in what is now Iraq.

Ancient China was ruled by Empress Wu Zetian. She ruled for 40 years initially through her husband and sons and later on her own. She shaped a more efficient and less corrupt government, revitalized the economy and culture, bucked the aristocracy to advance the peasant class and conquered new territory in Korea and Central Asia.

Ancient Egypt was led by Hatshepsut. She ruled for two decades and is considered the first important female ruler known to history. To be accepted she co-ruled with her stepson, dressed masculine by wearing royal kilts and false beards. Her abilities created prosperity, peace and artistic creativity.

In the stories of these ancient female leaders it's a lack of men that allow for their rule. They were there as placeholders, and they usually have a bad end—unrelated to their ability to rule or their accomplishments. Their lives and achievements were often scrubbed from collective memory by subsequent male rulers eager to take credit and reinforce established patriarchal norms.

The stories of these ancient female leaders, are often used as cautionary tales preventing many from seeing a more complete picture of their real lives and accomplishments and reinforcing the ideas that female leaders are unwelcome or even evil.

Why am I telling you this history? What/How could their stories impact our District or Club? Unfortunately, we often contribute to the out loud and low background noise that undermines female leaders both inside and outside of Federation. We become part of the chorus that helps to scrub the accomplishments of female leaders out of our collective memory.

WOMEN'S HISTORY - CONTINUED

No leader is perfect nor are they expected to be. Many a male leader has been a flop or done horrible things. Their faults are more often overlooked than those of female leaders. In fact it is not just the men but it is also we women that hold female leaders to the higher standard of perfection just to be considered as doing a good job. Starting in Federation and expanding into our lives, we have the power to stop being part of the chorus that throws shade on female leaders. Change that last comes from the bottom up. Stop sharing stories of the "horrible thing you saw". If you as a member see a weakness/have an issue, choose to be part of the support system that helps our women leaders succeed.

LEADS: Leadership – Education – and – Development – Seminar

The seminar is held annually in conjunction with the GFWC International Convention. One attendee from each State Federation will attend. The purpose is to encourage and train club members to accept leadership opportunities at all levels of Federation.

GFWC covers a portion of the attendees' expenses, including:

Round-trip travel to and from the GFWC Convention city*

One-half of room charge for two nights at official Convention hotel*

Breakfast and lunch during the LEADS program

Discounted Convention meal charges

CFWC will cover registration and additionally underwrite a portion of the Attendees' portion of expenses. **SGVD** budgets towards expenses for the LEADS candidate to attend the CFWC February State Board meeting.

Criteria for Application for LEADS:

- 1. Demonstrates leadership capabilities at the club level as an active Officer or chairperson.
- 2. Exhibits a commitment to Federation.
- Exhibits an understanding of the GFWC mission of community service,
 illustrated by programs/projects in which she has been involved.
- Demonstrates leadership skills, including but not limited to the following(describe these in the narrative form) organized, responsible, trustworthy, enthusiastic, and flexible.
- 5. Exhibits an interest and willingness to pursue higher leadership positions in Federation.
- 6. Agrees to share information gained from participating in LEADS with others in our State.
- 7. Understands and accepts potential expenses involved in participation.
- 8. Has **not** held elected positions at or beyond the State level.
- 9. Has **not** attended a previous LEADS program.

This District will select one candidate and submit the application to State. The State will choose one (1) candidate to attend the LEADS seminar at the GFWC Annual International Convention. If selected by our District, you will be invited to attend a mini seminar provided by our State (CFWC) Federation at the February State Board meeting. Your attendance is encouraged.

Deadline: All Applications due by November 8, 2024 (District Board Meeting). Submit APPLICATION FORM, six (6) copies, along with club letter of support, plus two (2) letters of support from active GFWC members. DO NOT SUBMIT THE APPLICATION TO ANYONE AT STATE FEDERTION (as directed). Only submit to SGVD LEADS Chairperson who will send the appropriate application to STATE. The LEADS application form is available on the GFWC website – gfwc.org/LEADS. Information is also available in the GFWC Club Manual. LEADS application is also in SGVD Yearbook.
