Membership matters and we are the Diversity Team we will have discussions on Recurrent Retention and Recognition.

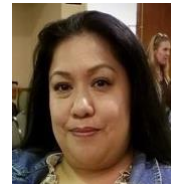

You Told Me Rules Help and You Mislead Me!

The purpose of Roberts Rules of Order is to create a structure where members of the group are given an equal opportunity to express their views, are treated with respect by all and the group can make the necessary decisions to carry out their business. As with any rules, they can be used to help the group function or their complexity can be used to disrupt the group.

Let's say members get so upset that things did not go their way that they prevent action from happening by constantly raising baseless points of order, appealing the passage of a motion, making motions to adjourn every few minutes and/or making frivolous amendments. Members might make motions that violate the Bylaws or Standing Rules, conflict with an already adopted motion, repeatedly bring back the same question that was already defeated and/or bring up something outside the scope of the organization. These actions actually have names – dilatory and improper motions.

These members are outwardly following the rules but not the following the essence of the rules. When this happens all but one of us can breathe a sigh of relief that we are not the Chair. I would hope that the Chair, other officers and friends of the offending members regularly work behind the scenes to help disruptive members feel understood and persuade them to be more supportive of the group's work.

If informal measures do not work, the Chair can stop the conversation and say "The member(s) will come to order and be seated. Any member can ask the Chair to call the unruly members to order. The Chair can actually formally ask members attending the meeting where the disruption is happening for suggestions on what to do and as a very last resort this can include requiring the troublesome members to leave the meeting. I wish I had the silver bullet to share on how to stop this more than saying we need to model what we aspire to by listening, dealing with each action and keeping on the path until the decision is made and the group can finally function.

Several months ago I shared the idea that nothing ensures everyone agrees with the decisions that are made. Democracy is not easy. One basic concept that is needed for a group to function is to radically accept nothing will ever be perfect, sometimes we get what we want, sometimes we don't and the needs of the group require members to support or at the very least acquiesce to the will of the majority. Since we are part of a team and we all want what is best, let's use the rules to help us all.

In memorial of Tzeitel Paras-Caracci Duarte Woman's Club President 08/08/71 to 06/24/22.

Tzeitel Paras-Caracci joined Duarte Woman's Club December 2018. When recruited, she said "Duarte Woman's Club is the only club I would join."

When she had only been a member a few months, she volunteered to get all the items needed for the "Spa Basket" for the spring Fashion Show "opportunity baskets." She continued to be active in the club.

She was elected President for 06/21 to 05/22—although she was sick, she continued to be active in the club and in the community. She was reelected DWC President for 06/22 to 5/23—sadly, unable to serve this second term.



When asked to be our President, she said "I am honored." (She who has had many honors and awards, was honored to be our President).

Tzeitel arranged for us to meet via ZOOM. We were able to meet in person from December 2021 through June 2022. Some SGVD members met her on ZOOM; several of SGVD members met her in person at our March 2022 "Woman of the Year" presentation.

One project that she started was called "Flags of Honor". She solicited sponsorships from corporations and flag dedications from individuals. Flags were displayed Memorial weekend at a local park that is actually dedicated to veterans. People were asked to donate a flag in honor of a veteran. Veterans' names were listed in a colorful commemorative booklet. Due to her influence, a local printer donated the cost of the brochure. We continued the project in 2022 and will continue the project in her honor.

Tzeitel was born in Quezon City, Philippines; her parents came to the US when she was only two. She was elected to Duarte City Council in 2001 and continued to be reelected term after term. She served as Mayor 2006, 2011, 2015, and 2019. She was the longest sitting Filipino American politician in the US.

She served on many city, county, and state boards. At her memorial, she was lauded by city, county, and state reps, and, yes, even praised a federal representative. Duarte Woman's Club chose Elizabeth Bitow to praise her at the memorial.

Tzeitel was little but mighty. She was known as the "Hello Kitty Mayor" and danced with the Duarte Teen Dance Group every chance she got.

She "fought the good fight" against cancer for three years. She is survived by her husband K. C. Caracci and their 9-year-old son, Jack Russell Caracci. She is also survived by her parents Lino and Russell Paras (who lived next door) and brothers Bertrand and John Paul.

Her husband proposed to her at a city council meeting and they were married in a Duarte city park. She loved Duarte and Duarte loved her.

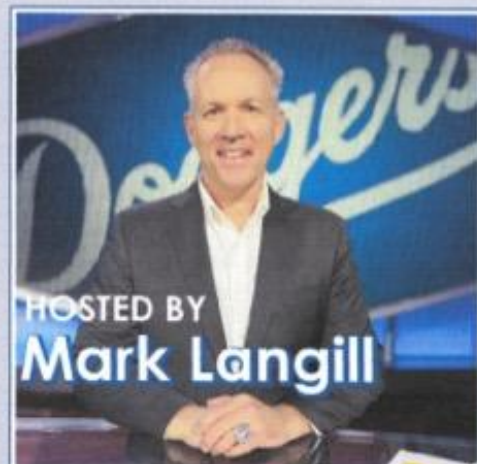

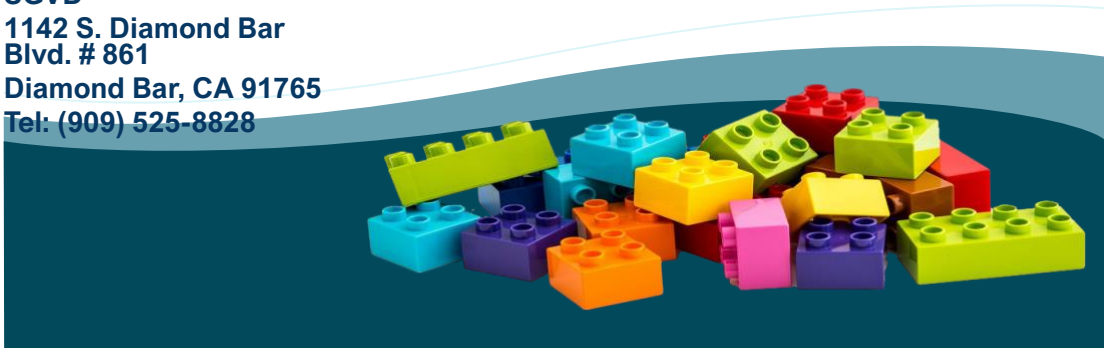
