#### I Never Said That—The Real Purpose of Minutes

Minutes are a legal document. They are used to confirm the decisions and are supporting records for expenses. *They only contain what was done—not what was said*. Minutes that contain more than as Sergeant Joe Friday said "just the facts ma'am" technically, are not minutes.

Prior to approving, minutes need to be read by the group, corrected and approved. We generally send a draft by email and at the meeting do the final corrections and approval. Minutes are not worth the paper they are written on or the electronic trail of the e-mail they were sent in until the final vote of approval.

Robert had a format for everything! Minutes are no exception.

- The type of meeting, the name of the organization, the date, time and location
- A statement confirming who presided and who took the minutes
- A mention of whether the previous meeting's minutes were approved as read or as corrected and the date of the approval.
- All main motions, the name of the person making the motion
  - o The final wording and approved, not approved, disposed of.
  - O You can note it was debated/amended— not what people said in the debate.
- Information about the vote
  - Number for/against/abstaining
  - o If a roll call vote is taken the names and vote of each member
  - o Ballot vote results

- All secondary motions not lost or withdrawn (recess, suspending rules, establishing a specific adjournment time, postpone, order for a ballot vote etc.)
- Notices of motions to be discussed at a future meeting.
- All Points of Order, their disposition and the Chair's reasons for the ruling.
- Statement that a report was given including the topic.
- Names of guest speakers and the subject of the presentation
- Statements that an informal conversation was conducted and the topic—not what was said.
- The name of any members who behaves badly enough to require the Chair to admonish them in the meeting and the reasons for the admonishment
- Time of adjournment

Remember, when only the actions are contained in the minutes and not who said what to whom, correction are easier and life is far more simple. Everyone is fully informed, is allowed to participate in the decision making and we can get on with the business of helping our communities. Robert knew a thing or two about meetings.

November was Native American Heritage Month, and although this article is a little late, I wanted to share information with you about Winona LaDuke, a Native American activist, economist, environmentalist, and industrial hemp grower. She is known for her work on tribal land claims and preservation, as well as sustainable development.

In <u>1996</u> and <u>2000</u>, she ran for Vice President of the United as the nominee of the <u>Green Party of the United States</u>, on a ticket headed by <u>Ralph Nader</u>. She is the executive director and a cofounder (along with the <u>Indigo Girls</u> of <u>Honor the Earth</u>,, a Native

environmental advocacy organization that played an active role in the <u>Dakota Access Pipeline protests</u>. In <u>2016</u>, she received an <u>electoral vote</u> for vice president. In doing so, she became the first <u>Green Party</u> member to receive an electoral vote.

LaDuke was born in Los Angeles, California on August 18, 1959, to parents Vincent and Betty (Bernstein) LaDuke. Her father, also known as Sun Bear, was Anishinaabe (or Ojibwe) from the White Earth Reservation in Minnesota. He was an actor, writer, and activist. Her mother was an artist and activist. LaDuke is an Anishinaabekwe (Ojibwe) enrolled member of the Mississippi Band Anishinaabeg. LaDuke's parents divorced when she was five and she moved with her mother, who was of Russian Jewish descent, to Ashland, Oregon. LaDuke visited White Earth frequently and, at her mother's encouragement, spent summers living in Native communities to strengthen her connection with her heritage.

LaDuke graduated from Harvard and, she took a position as principal of the reservation high school at the White Earth Ojibwe reservation in Minnesota. She soon became involved in a lawsuit filed by the Anishinaabeg people to recover lands promised to them by an 1867 federal treaty. At the time of the treaty, the White Earth Reservation included 837,000 acres, but government policies allowed lumber companies and other non-Native groups to take over more than 90 percent of the land by 1934. After four years of litigation, however, the lawsuit was dismissed. The lawsuit's failure motivated LaDuke's ensuing efforts to protect Native lands.

In 1989, LaDuke completed a master's degree in community economic development at Antioch University. That same year, she founded the White Earth Land Recovery Project (WELRP), using funds the Reebok Foundation awarded her for her human rights work. WELRP is an organization that seeks to buy back reservation land previously purchased by non-Native people to foster sustainable development and provide economic opportunity for the Native population. It is now one of the largest reservation-based nonprofits in the country.

Though busy with the WELRP, LaDuke continued her advocacy work with the Indigenous Women's Network. In the early 1990s, LaDuke arranged a national concert series with the musical group Indigo Girls to raise awareness among young people about Native issues. In 1993, LaDuke and the Indigo Girls

co-founded Honor the Earth, an advocacy and fundraising group that works on behalf of Native environmental organizations. Honor the Earth has granted over two million dollars to more than 200 Native American communities since its founding. LaDuke has received many honors for advocacy work. In 1994, Time magazine named her one of the Fifty Leaders for the Future.

Today, the mother of six grown children (three biological and three adopted) devotes much of her time to farming. Located on the White Earth reservation, her farm grows heritage vegetables and hemp. LaDuke tries to publicize hemp's environmental advantages: it requires less water to grow than cotton; can replace petroleum-based synthetics in clothing and other products; and absorbs carbon from the atmosphere, rather than releasing it. Winona's Hemp & Heritage Farm is her latest endeavor; a farm and nonprofit agency, its mission is to create an Indigenous women-led economy based on local food, energy, and fiber, which is kind to the Earth.
